

A CAMERA TRAP NETWORK

FOR WILDLIFE MONITORING

The Office of Hunting and Fishing has established a network of camera traps to monitor wildlife across the canton. The information collected helps track the distribution and development of a wide range of species, supporting wildlife research, conservation and management.



WHICH SPECIES ARE MONITORED?

The monitoring covers many of Ticino's wildlife species, from large carnivores such as wolves and lynx to ungulates and other mammals of ecological and management interest, including wild boar, hare and chamois.



WHERE ARE THE CAMERA TRAPS LOCATED?

Camera traps are installed throughout the region following scientific survey methods. They are typically placed along hiking trails, forest roads and other routes frequently used by wildlife. The presence or absence of a camera trap at a particular location does not necessarily mean that a specific species is present or absent there.



PRIVACY

The camera traps are used exclusively for wildlife monitoring. Images capturing people or vehicles are automatically deleted using a dedicated software.



HOW CAN YOU IDENTIFY THEM?

Every camera trap is clearly marked with an identification sticker and an information sign displaying a QR code.
